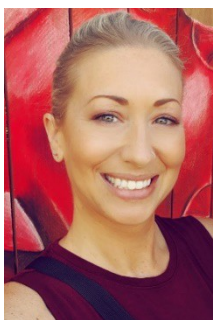


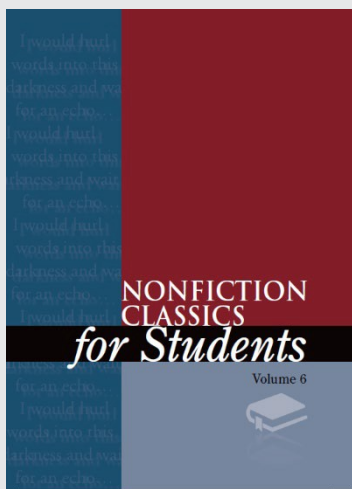
RELEASED FROM THE GALE VAULT

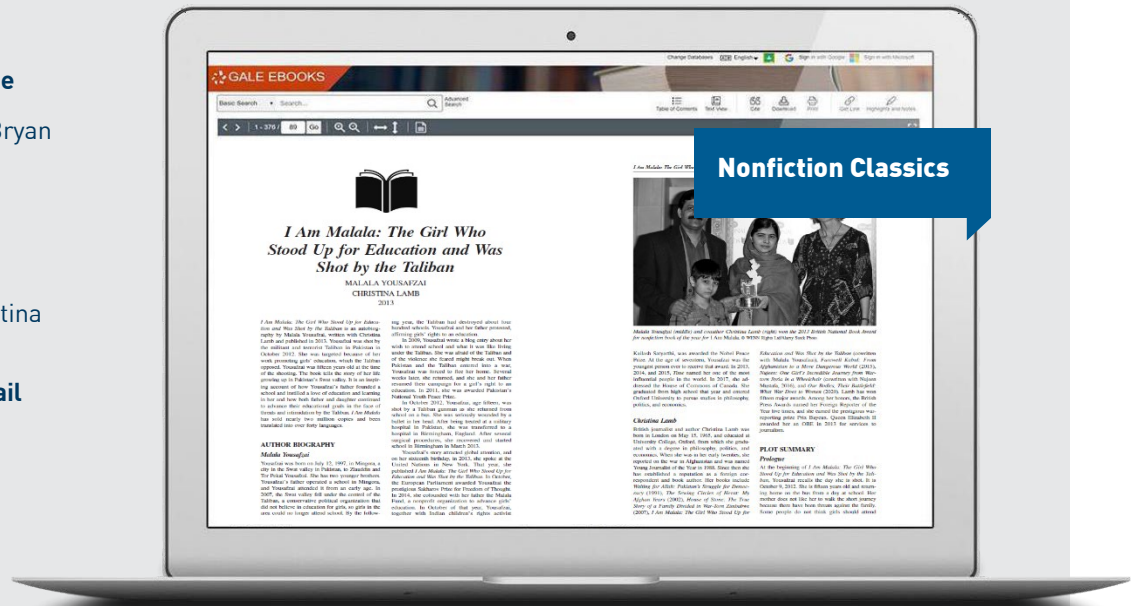

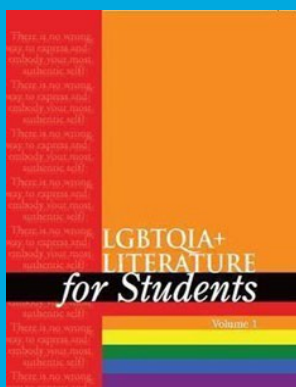
